People, look East, and sing today: Love, the Lord, is on the way.

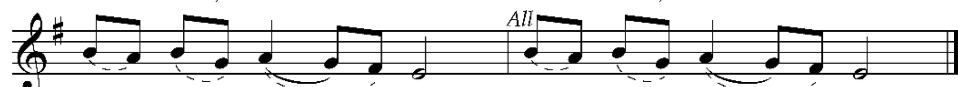
