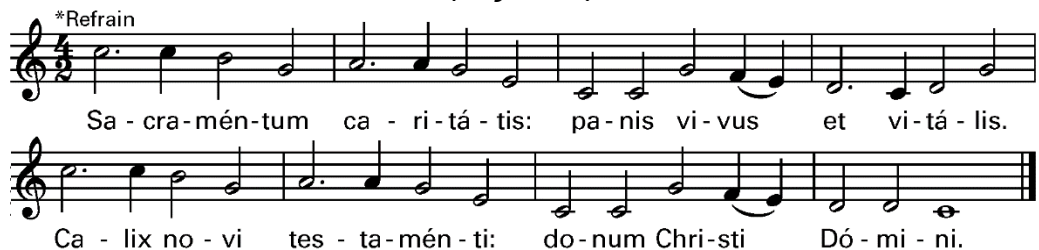
3. Very bread, good shepherd, tend us,


